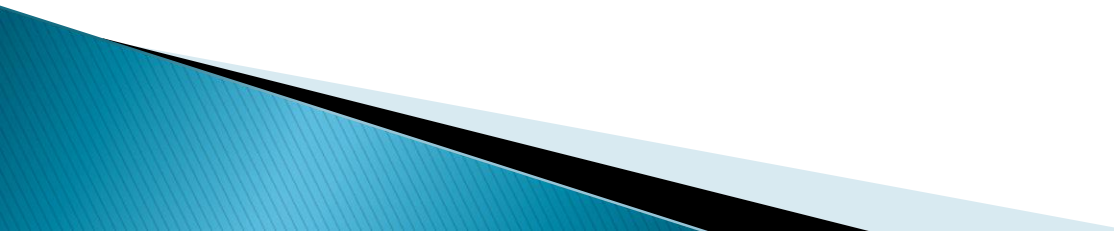

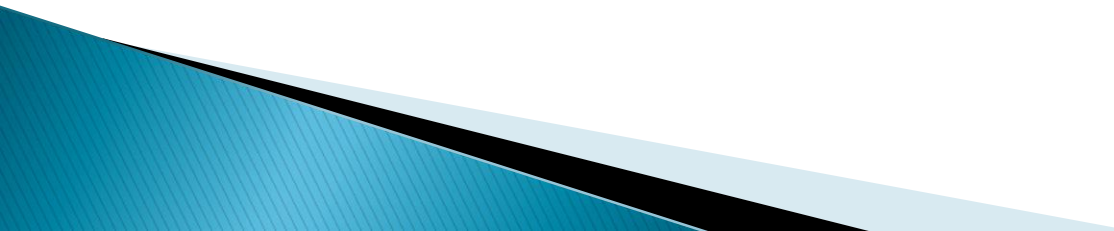
Background

 - Dementia United Transformation Programme
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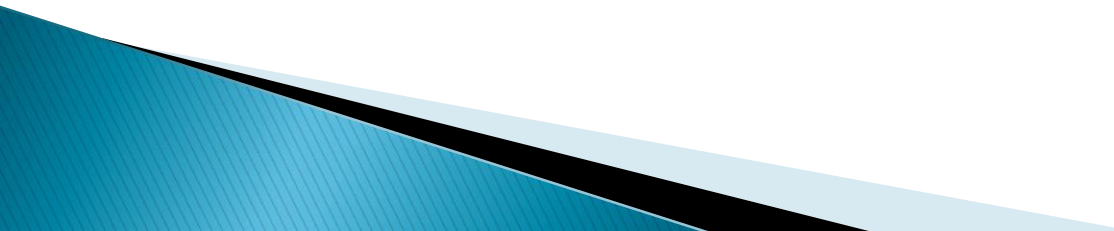
Aims to.....

Bringing Things Together

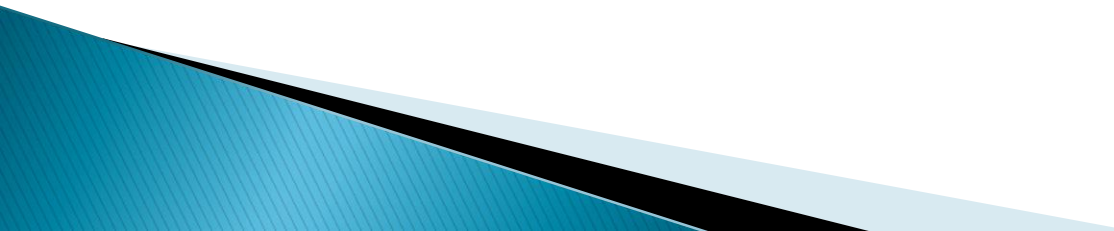
- ▶ The pledges will interlink

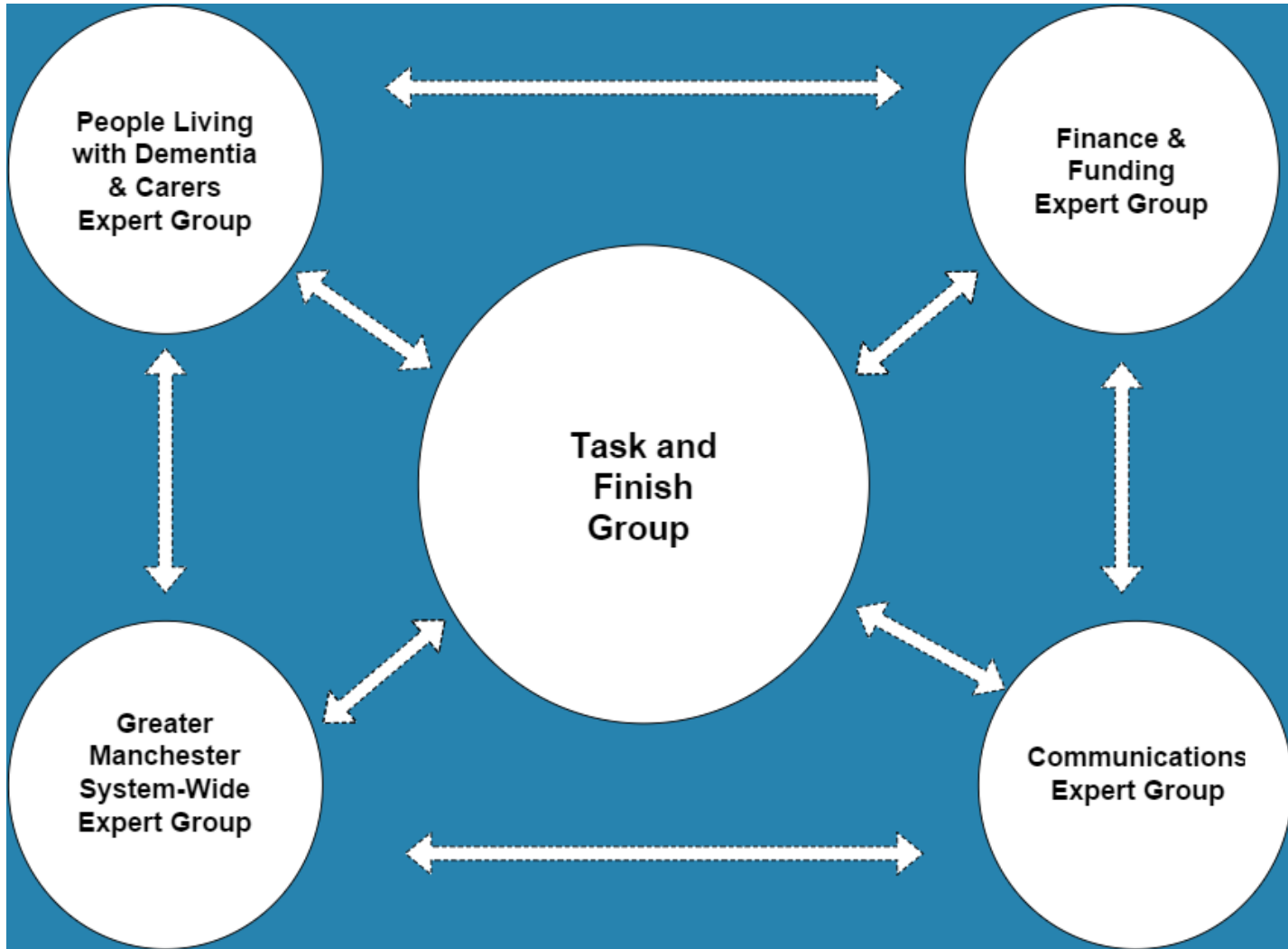

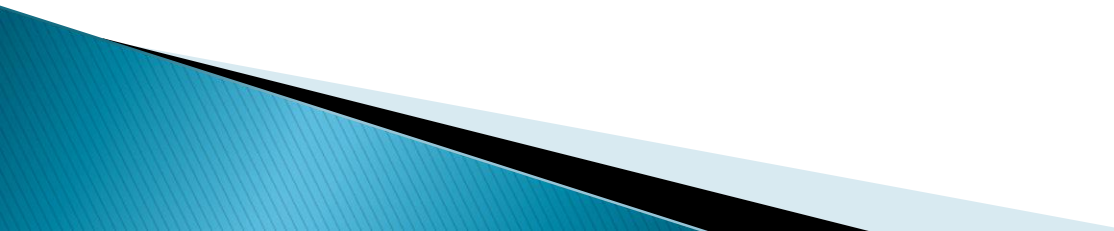
Background

- Following the Devolution Joint Commissioning Board on Friday 8th April, the proposal for Dementia United was presented; in particular the concept idea of Social Finance for the key worker pledge was detailed. It was evident that there was support in principle for the transformation programme, however it was felt that a further 3–4 month piece of work was required to fully develop the ideas, which will be led by a Task and Finish group to ensure a collective understanding and agreement
 - The further work required is seen as an opportunity, enabling the programme to provide more detail on its delivery model and structure
 - Led by the Task and Finish Group, a series of Expert groups are to be formed to help facilitate the delivery of this proposal
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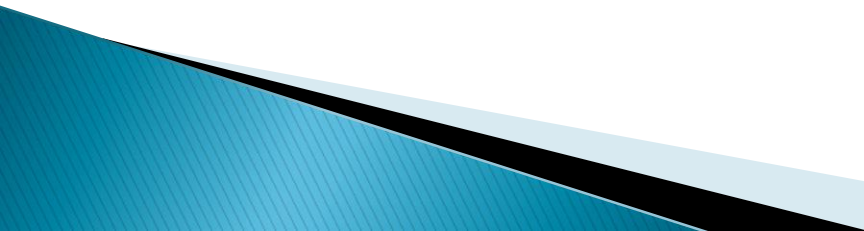
Delivery Structure



Purpose of the Task and Finish Group

- Responsibility for the development of a detailed proposal which:
 - provides clarity on the Dementia United delivery model, describing *all* elements of the programme and suggestions to the commissioning/funding of the model
 - proposes a structure which will deliver the programme including timelines
 - Act as a lead working group, delegating responsibility to expert groups who will undertake specialist elements of the proposal
 - Responsibility for input, oversight and production of the final proposal document which is to be submitted to the Joint Commissioning Board
 - Meeting / have discussions on a frequent basis to ensure delivery of the Dementia United proposal
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Purpose of Expert Groups

- Be a small group who are responsible for:
 - Responding to specialist work directed by the Task and Finish group in a timely manner, in keeping with the deadline of the proposal
 - Reporting into the Task and Finish group, via named individuals, ensuring that matters / actions are noted
 - Acting on behalf of colleagues from across Greater Manchester who operate within a similar capacity or organisation, to ensure that there is a collective opinion from that role or sector
 - Ensuring that all expert groups include, or engage with a person/people with dementia and carers of someone with dementia from the outset as a core group member to aid the development and design of Dementia United
